New Urban Arts is a nationally-recognized community arts studio for high school students and emerging artists in Providence, RI. Our mission is to build a vital community that empowers young people as artists and leaders to develop a creative practice they can sustain throughout their lives.

Overview

New Urban Arts is hiring a Resident Artist Mentor (RAM) in the Literary Arts. We are looking for a generalist who can work with students on various skills and in various styles, from performative self-expressions undertaken purely for personal satisfaction to school assignments and college essays. The RAM will embody our core values of connection, voice, inclusion, leadership, and risk by:

- Participating in the life of New Urban Arts' afterschool studio on a daily basis;
- Creating meaningful relationships with youth;
- Teaching, coaching, and editing students in a wide range of writing styles, including poetry, lyrics, and various forms of prose, such as fiction, creative non-fiction, academic writing, and college essays;

Instructional Responsibilities:

- Support students' self-expression through writing, including the development of their personal style and voice.
- Help students prepare written and performative pieces for gallery shows.
- Work closely with the A Life After School Coordinator, who runs our postsecondary advising program, to support students in the written aspects of the college process, including college essays.

• Support students on writing assignments and other written homework.

Community Responsibilities

- Create and maintain a safe environment for students to develop their creative practice, encouraging collaboration and creating a learning space clear of bias and judgment.
- Steward New Urban Arts' study room, including maintaining supplies, keeping the space tidy, and communicating material needs to other staff.
- Model authentic youth engagement, including using an inquiry-based, asset-based, supportive approach to meeting students' needs.
- Build relationships with students and promote relationship-building between students, mentors, and staff.
- Support volunteer writing mentors.
- Attend bi-weekly program team meetings and monthly mentor meetings.
- Contribute to the New Urban Arts community through participation in exhibitions, events and workshops.

Qualifications:

- Excellent writing skills in a variety of styles.
- Excellent editing skills, including the ability to communicate the grammatical, syntactical, semantic, and stylistic reasons for suggestions and feedback.
- Ability to work collaboratively with New Urban Arts' team to foster an excellent, supportive learning environment.
- Demonstrated success working in diverse environments.
- Experience forming positive, supportive relationships with teenagers.
- Positive, direct verbal and written communication skills, including proficient and regular use of email.
- Flexibility, inclusiveness, and responsiveness.
