The College Exploration program at New Urban Arts is an opportunity for rising seniors, who are active participants of New Urban Arts, to begin the college application process in community with other artists and creative thinkers. Under the guidance of Mara O’Day, the A Life After School Coordinator, students will build college lists, start the Common Application, and begin forming college essays, all while developing their personal story in a variety of visual media. The program will also consist of visits to college campuses and art museums in Rhode Island and Massachusetts, and students will have the chance to hear from New Urban Arts Alumni who are currently or about to enroll in college.

To qualify for the College Exploration program at New Urban Arts, students must be entering their senior year of high school and be enrolled as a student at New Urban Arts. Students must be able to participate fully and commit to attending the program over the summer of 2017. Any necessary absence must be communicated in advance of the program start date to the A Life After School Coordinator, Mara O’Day, at 401-751-4556.
